The "Well Informed" Texas Well Owner Network (TWOON) program is an educational program that gives well owners the opportunity to have their well water samples screened for common contaminants including total coliforms, E. coli bacteria, nitrates, nitrites and iron. The program is designed to help well owners understand the results, water well production practices and focuses on wellhead protection and recommendations for remediating well contamination.

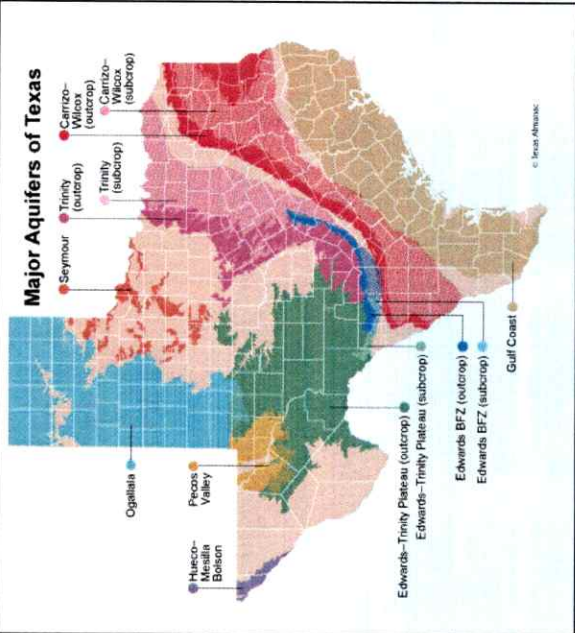

Where does water come from and where does it go?

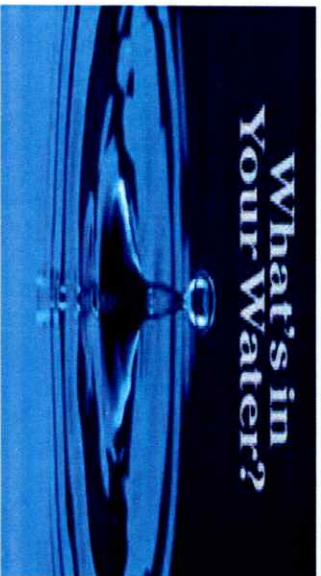


Amended Rule on Well Plugging Program:

recharging and prevention of waste of groundwater and of groundwater reservoirs or their subdivisions and to control subsidence caused by the withdrawal of water from those reservoirs. It has an obligation under Texas Water Code 36.107 to develop a groundwater management plan that will state how the district will meet that purpose. Under Texas Water Code 36C Section 36.101, the District has the authority to adopt and enforce rules that the district feels are needed to carry out that purpose.
